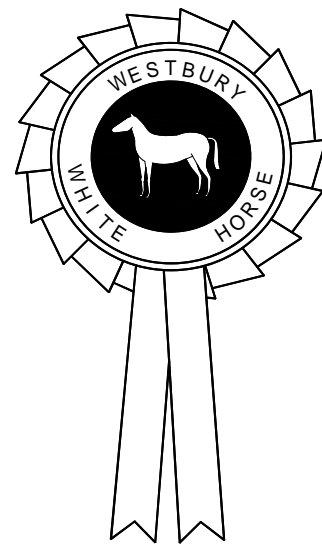

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

The word 'Dog' includes both sexes.

In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts to the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count to the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any Class i.e. **13th August 2010**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety Classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this regulation are:

- (1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under twelve months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed.
- (2) A dog in Any Variety Veteran class.
- (3) As provided in Kennel Club Definitions of classes.
- (4) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

1. Withdrawal. The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations (1), 9(j) and 20.
2. Transfer.
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively of the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no Puppy class or Junior class respectively, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.
JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show
GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show
VETERAN	For dogs of not less than seven years on the day of the Show
ANY VARIETY NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED	For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled
ANY VARIETY	For any breed or variety of a breed of dog. No dog is eligible for entry in these variety classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed Class where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. In the case of this Show, the exemption from this regulation is Puppy, unless a class for dogs under 12 months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed;

JUNIOR HANDLING A class to be judged on handling, open to all dogs; the entry being restricted by the age of the handler in each class.

ADULT HANDLING A class to be judged on handling, open to all dogs; the entry being restricted by the age of the handler in each class.

All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for entry.

10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

11. Where a **Best Puppy in Show** competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the show. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group & Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Consequently the selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.

BEST PUPPY IN GROUP AND SUBSEQUENT PUPPY GROUP PLACINGS must be selected from those puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.

BEST PUPPY IN SHOW must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group Winners provided they are unbeaten by any other puppy.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION : Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes and Best Puppy in Breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy Group and Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety classes when judged before breed classes

PROVISO : For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

12. The dog declared **BEST IN SHOW** is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show.

a. **BEST OF BREED**. Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed must be declared. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be selected from which the Best of Breed must be declared.

b. **BEST IN SHOW** must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining unbeaten winning dogs following the selection for Best in Show.

SHOWS JUDGED ON THE GROUP SYSTEM : Definition : Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one Group, as defined in Kennel Club Regulations B (A), and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for

the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show

BEST IN SHOW AND SUBSEQUENT GROUP PLACINGS must be selected from:-

(a) The Best of Breed winners in each Group provided that they are unbeaten winning dogs.

(b) The best unbeaten dogs from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each Group.

BEST IN SHOW : must be selected from the Best of Group winners provided they are unbeaten. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection of Best in Show.

c. Withdrawal from other competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.

d. Proviso. For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Group or Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

15. All exhibitors must be familiar with KC Reg F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16. The use of chalks, powders or any other similar substances is prohibited within the precincts of the Show.

17. Cages, grooming tables and trolleys must not obstruct gangways and are not allowed at the ringside.

18. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.

19. Animals Allowed in Show. No animal other than an exhibit shall be brought into the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the committee

20. No dog shall be allowed in the judging ring other than those competing in the class being judged.

21. The committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for the products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition (KCSR (F)).

22. Every person attending this Show must agree to compensate and/or indemnify the Society for any loss or damage to any property or building within the Showground which are owned, hired, leased or borrowed by the Society caused with or without negligence by any person under the age of 18 years who is brought to the Show or for whom they are responsible.

23. Should any question arise not provided for in these Rules and Regulations the decision of the committee shall be final subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club. The Committee of the Kennel Club shall be the main Court of Appeal or Umpire in all questions or disputes of any kind.
